It is a very special day for our parish. Fr. Joseph Redfern is not a native of our parish, but, by mutual adoption, he is one of us. We are blessed. On behalf of the parish I extend congratulations to Fr. Redfern, his parents, brother and sisters. A man progresses toward the priesthood and finally comes to that day by reason of many prayers, much effort, and the support of those closest to him. Family support is almost beyond exaggeration important and will remain important to the new priest. The Sunday of a priest's First Mass is forever engraved on his memory. (I remember mine vividly after 45 years.) On that observation follows this thought. The Church needs Sunday. Sunday is the day of Resurrection. Each Sunday is a celebration of the Easter event. The Resurrection of Christ is simply the greatest moment of all human history. It is the day human life opened up to the possibility of eternal life with the Risen Christ Who has taken our human nature into the intimacy of the life of the Holy Trinity. Sunday is the day of hope and joy, and our world needs an infusion of hope and joy on a daily basis. At the heart of Sunday is the celebration of the Lord's death and resurrection in the divine liturgy.

The liturgy of the Mass can't happen without the priest who acts in the person of Christ when the divine fire leaps from heaven to earth at the voice of the priest using the words of Christ, "This is my body; this is my blood." The Church needs Sunday, but Sunday needs the priest, and that is why Fr. Redfern's First Mass Sunday is an historically important day for the parish and for the world. God bless, strengthen, and guide you, Father, through many, many fruitful years of service to God's people.

New Pastoral Council members, Scott Doberstein and Karen Perry, were welcomed. Msgr. called the joint meeting of both councils to inform them of the Diocesan Corporate Reorganization. Each parish in the Diocese of La Crosse will now incorporate into a separate religious corporation. Articles of Incorporation were reviewed and by-laws were read and discussed. Mark Chamberlain (Finance Council) & Tom Kieffer (Pastoral Council) were elected to serve on the Board of Directors for Blessed Sacrament. The meeting ended with a blessing from Msgr. Hundt.
